SPEAKERS AND WORKSHOP LEADERS



Dr. Brian A de Vries (BBA, M.Div., Th.M., Ph.D.) is Principal and Senior Lecturer at *Mukhanyo Theological College*. He is a minister of the Reformed Churches of South Africa (GKSA), sent to South Africa in 2005 as a missionary of the Heritage Reformed Congregations of North America (HRC-NA). Dr de Vries is presently leading his third church plant in South Africa and also serves as senior lecturer in the Faculty of Theology at North-West University and visiting professor at Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary in the United States. He and his wife, Lanae, have four children.



Rev. Isaac Makashinyi has been the pastor of *Emmasdale Baptist Church* in Lusaka, Zambia since 2008. He is the academic dean at the Lusaka Ministerial College, teaching Biblical Languages and Old Testament, and also an adjunct lecturer at the African Christian University. He has a Bachelor of Theology (B.Th) from the Evangelical University, Ndola, Zambia, and Master of Divinity (M.Div) from the Reformed Theological Seminary, Jackson, Mississippi. He is associate editor for a Zambian periodical, *Reformation Zambia*. He has been married to Shupe for twenty years, and the Lord has blessed them with a daughter and a son.



Rev. John Stambolie is an ordained teaching elder of the Presbytery of Bulawayo. He is currently enrolled as an M. Div. student with the *Africa Reformation Theological Seminary* in Kampala, Uganda. John first served as an administrator at the *Theological College of Zimbabwe (TCZ)* and as a volunteer with the *Accrediting Council for Theological Education in Africa (ACTEA)*. Eight years ago John began theological studies. He serves with Jorum Mugari, the Chairman of the Presbytery Education and Credentialing Committee, in the Church Based Discipleship work at the local church.



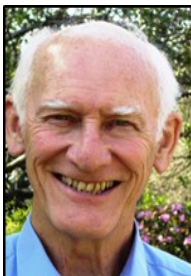
Rev. Rodgers Atwebembeire is an ordained Pastor of a Reformed Presbyterian church in Kampala-Uganda. He is the Regional Director for Eastern Africa for the Africa Centre for Apologetics Research (ACFAR) and a lecturer (African Church History, Apologetics, Cults & World Religions). He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Biblical Studies with Education and a Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership and Management. He is married with three children.



Dr Samson Makhado (Ph.D. in Curriculum Development) is the African Director of the Association of Christian Schools International (ASCI). He served for 30 years in public and private schools as teacher and principal, and then at ASCI since 1990. He also serves at the National Institute for Christian Studies in Australia, the University of Venda Science and Technology, and the University of Witwatersrand. He currently serves on various board and councils related to Christian education. He was awarded the title "professional of the year" by Princeton Global Network and received an honorary doctorate from The Institute for Christian Studies in May 2012.



Dr. Bosco Bangura studied at *Fourah Bay College* (Sierra Leone) and at the *Evangelische Theologische Faculteit* (Belgium), where, in collaboration with the *Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam*, he obtained a double PhD. He is a postdoctoral person at North West University, South Africa and missionary/associate pastor at *Word Communication Ministries*, Brussels, Belgium. Previously, he served in the pastoral ministry and taught at various theological colleges in Sierra Leone, Liberia and Uganda. His research, teaching and publications are in the fields of missiology and the intercultural theologies.



Bill Houston (BA, BSc, MTh, D Min) was born in Zambia, but grew up in Cape Town. He lectured in a missions training college in the UK for 6 years before returning to Pietermaritzburg to teach in a seminary for 13 years. From 2005, he worked for *Overseas Council International* for 6 years visiting 40 evangelical seminaries in 23 African countries. He retired in 2010, but still teach on a D Min programme in Nairobi. In recent years he went to South Sudan as a consultant to the African Inland Church. He is currently a 'Scholar care Giver' of African students doing doctorates in South Africa who are on John Stott scholarships.



Dr. Mark Kreitzer, M. Div.; D. Miss.; PhD., in Intercultural Studies through the Reformed Theological Seminary. He is currently serving at the Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona, USA where he is teaching on Christian Theology, World Religions, Christianity in a Global Context, Anthropology for Cross-Cultural Ministry, Christian Worldview and Mission and Spiritual Formation for Christian Leaders.
